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Future Health Today has developed a series of live, collaborative case-based education and information ECHO sessions in which subject-matter experts support on-the-ground practitioners to manage complex patients. The hub and spoke model brings best practice care to the front line and enables faster intervention at the community level. Project ECHO is an opportunity for participants to share de-identified cases from their practice and receive advice and support from the general practice community and topic experts.
